The Texas Ranch Roundup is the "original" event designed to replicate the big cattle roundups of the late 1800s and early 1900s and, in 1981, was the first of the hundreds of ranch rodeos that now occur all over North America. The first event committee determined that the participating ranches would be full-time, historic Texas cattle ranches, and that the participants would be only owners, full time hands, and immediate family members. They also determined that the ranch families should be involved outside the arena to showcase real ranch life and the talents that exist in the families.

BQA Tip of the Month: Horn Fly Control

Horn fly control is important for animal welfare, performance and herd health. Research has shown that if horn flies are not controlled, animal gains are often reduced by 0.09 lbs/day for nursing calves and 0.20 lbs/day for stocker cattle and replacement heifers. To reduce problems with resistance, chemical classes of topical insecticides should be

rotated each year. The topical products currently available can be classified as pyrethroids, organophosphates or avermectins. Remember to rotate chemical classes and not just brand names or application methods.

Reward Offered for Information in Killing of Steer in Randall County

Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers Association (TSCRA) Special Ranger H.L. Dempsey and local authorities are seeking information after an Angus steer was found shot to death on a ranch south of Canyon.

A cash reward of up to \$3,000 is being offered for information leading to the indictment or arrest of the person or persons responsible for the crime. Operation Cow Thief, an anti-theft initiative led by TSCRA, is offering a \$500 reward, with the victims offering a combined \$2,500 additional reward.

On June 27, a landowner found the 600-pound Angus steer dead in his pasture. It is believed the animal was shot from FM 1714, also known as Buffalo Lake Road, sometime after the afternoon of June 25.

The case is being investigated by the Randall County Sherriff's Department with the assistance of TSCRA's Special Rangers. Anyone with information that could help identify the perpetrator should call TSCRA's Operation Cow Thief hotline at (888) 830-2333, Special Ranger H.L. Dempsey at (806) 356-6101, or the Randall County Sheriff's Department.

All information is kept confidential and tips may be provided anonymously.
