## August BQA Tip: Horns and Dehorning

Management of horns in beef cattle is important for animal welfare, animal handling, handler safety, and animal value. The easiest way to manage horns is by using polled genetics; quality polled genetics can be found in all major beef breeds. Using homozygous polled bulls in *Bos taurus* cattle will result in a 100 percent polled calf crop even if the cows have horns; in *Bos indicus*-influenced cattle the expression pattern is sometimes different, but most calves will be polled. Stocker and feeder cattle with horns should be dehorned or tipped as early as possible using methods that minimize stress.

## Missing Excavator Recovered by TSCRA Special Rangers

TSCRA Special Ranger John Bradshaw sought public assistance in locating the 2009 Caterpillar 320DL excavator, worth approximately \$200,000, stolen in mid-February from a ranch near Holliday.

Four months later, an anonymous tip helped lead Bradshaw and Special Ranger Troy McKinney to a remote property south of Saint Jo. A DPS helicopter identified an excavator of a similar make and model to the one stolen, and further investigation confirmed that the serial number was a match. The excavator was impounded at the Montague County Sheriff's Office until a property hearing.

The investigation into who stole the excavator continues. Bradshaw and McKinney asking anyone with information that could aid investigators or identify additional suspects should call Special Ranger Bradshaw at 940-389-6123. All information is kept confidential and tips may be provided anonymously.

## Branded Cattle Key in Felony Theft of Livestock Indictment

William "Willie" Rittenbaugh, 47, of Mount Calm, was indicted July 6 on charges of Theft of Livestock. The indictment is the result of an investigation led by TSCRA Special Ranger Marvin Wills.

The case began in May when a Hill County rancher contacted Wills and claimed that Rittenbaugh had stolen several his cattle. Wills located 11 head of cattle in Rittenbaugh's cattle pens, nine of which were branded with the victim's brand. After the cattle were identified, they were seized and returned to the victim.

Rittenbaugh was arrested June 20 by sheriff's deputies and booked into the Hill County jail. The evidence was presented to a Hill County grand jury, which handed down an indictment for third-degree felony theft of livestock. If convicted, Rittenbaugh could face up to 10 years in prison, fines, and restitution.
