Information Sought, Reward Offered in Henderson County Thefts

TSCRA Special Ranger Jimmy Dickson and local authorities are seeking information regarding the theft of farm and ranch equipment from a property near Eustace. Investigators believe this theft may be related to others in the Henderson County area.

Operation Cow Thief, an anti-theft initiative led by TSCRA, is offering a cash reward for information leading to the arrest and indictment of the person or persons responsible for the crime.

Sometime between Oct. 13 and Oct. 14, 2016, an unidentified suspect or suspects cut a gate lock to unlawfully enter a property on FM 2709. A 2011 Massey Ferguson MF1529 tractor, lowboy trailer and Bosch miter saw were stolen. Oddly, the thieves also took food from a refrigerator but left it in a nearby pasture.

Then, in the overnight hours between Dec. 13 and Dec. 14, an unknown suspect or suspects cut a gate lock to unlawfully enter a property in Henderson County outside of Athens. A trailer and a 2016 Caterpillar compact track loader were stolen from the property located off State Loop 7 near U.S. Highway 175. A building on the property was also burglarized, with thousands of dollars in tools and equipment stolen. Items taken from the structure include a Hustler zero-turn lawn mower, plasma cutter and pressure washer.

The cases are being investigated by the Henderson County Sheriff's Department with the assistance of TSCRA's special rangers. All information is kept confidential and tips may be provided anonymously.

BQA Tip of the Month: The Critical Role of Colostrum

The consumption of colostrum shortly after birth is critical to calf survival and health. During calving season, monitor newborns to ensure they are nursing. If calves haven't nursed within the first 10 - 12 hours, provide assistance to ensure adequate consumption of colostrum; in some instances, you may want to provide colostrum sooner. Before calving season begins, it is a



good idea to have an esophageal tube feeder and a source of colostrum on hand. Commercial colostrum products vary in the amount of immunoglobulin they contain, so make sure to get a product that is designed for replacement and not just supplement.

TSCRA Leader Testifies in Austin on Veterinarian Shortage

TSCRA Director Coleman Locke, Hungerford, testified Feb. 27 before the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Water and Rural Affairs in Austin. In his testimony, on behalf of TSCRA, he addressed a current shortage of large animal veterinarians to serve rural Texas. He conveyed a number of facts, including that Texas is tied for last in the country in the number of animals per veterinarian, and the situation is likely to worsen because 46 percent of rural veterinarians are over the age of 60. Locke closed by strongly asserting the need for the state legislature and Texas public universities to make a priority of addressing this growing shortage of food animal veterinary practitioners.
