

Coryell County Men Held on Livestock Theft Charges

James Anthony Manning, 30, and Dylan R. Robinson, 21, both of Coryell County, were charged with theft of livestock on June 15, in a case involving the theft of 2 bulls from a rancher south of Gatesville. TSCRA Special Ranger Marvin Wills led the investigation with assistance from the Coryell County Sheriff's Department.

of bulls that strayed onto a property neighboring a TSCRA member's ranch in Gatesville.

The bulls were not branded, but they had very distinct marks that assisted with identification. They had been consigned and sold at an auction 80 miles away.

Wills arrested Manning on theft of livestock charges. Robinson was already in the Coryell County Jail under a motion to revoke his probation from a 2011 theft case led by Wills and the Coryell County Sheriff's Department. Robinson is being held on a no-bond motion to revoke for the 2011 conviction.

TSCRA would like to thank the Coryell County Sheriff's Department for their assistance with this investigation.

"While we were able to identify these bulls by their specific markings, this is not always the case," said Wills. "It is important for ranchers to brand and keep an accurate count on their cattle. Following these precautions will help in the recovery of stolen livestock and serve as the best line of defense against cattle theft.

Arrest Made in String of Livestock, Guns and Ranching Equipment Thefts

CLINTON JAMES EASTER, 47, OF EASTLAND COUNTY, WAS ARRESTED JUNE 10 ON SUSpicion of stealing livestock, trailers, guns and ranching equipment from numerous victims in multiple central Texas counties.

TSCRA Special Rangers Joe Roberts and H.D. "Howard" Brittain led the

investigation, with assistance from Special Rangers Wayne Goodman, Marvin Wills and John Bradshaw.

According to Brittain, Easter allegedly hauled some cattle to the Graham County Livestock Auction. An auction employee who helped unload the cattle later read the "TSCRA Theft and Law, Crime Watch" section of *The Cattleman* magazine and realized that the



cattle he unloaded at the auction earlier that day were cattle that were reported missing. He contacted TSCRA market inspector Ronnie Ober and it was confirmed that the cattle were stolen.

TSCRA Special Rangers ran search warrants with the Texas Rangers, Texas Department of Public Safety Troopers, Cisco Police Department and the sheriff's departments in Eastland, Coleman, Comanche and Brown counties.

After running the warrants, Brittain was able to locate and arrest Easter on charges of theft of livestock. Other charges are expected to follow. Law enforcement officers recovered numerous cattle, trailers, guns and other stolen property, worth a total of more than \$100,000. Additional property is expected to be recovered.
