

High Court Says Clean Water Rule Suits Belong in District Courts

The Supreme Court ruled on Jan. 22 that challenges to an Environmental Protection Agency regulation defining the Clean Water Act term "waters of the United States" must be filed in federal district courts.

TSCRA President Richard Thorpe issued the following statement after the ruling on the proper venue for challenges to the 2015 Waters of the United States (WOTUS) rule:

"We applaud the U.S. Supreme Court's unanimous ruling that challenges to the Obama-era WOTUS rule belong in federal district courts, not federal appeals courts," said Thorpe. "This decision not only maintains the integrity of our judicial system but also ensures that challenges will first be weighed by courts closer to the people and communities they affect.

"The so-called WOTUS rule has already been withdrawn by the EPA, but the ruling sets a sound precedent for future challenges to over-reaching federal rules."

Drought in Texas and Oklahoma Increases Wildfire Risk Through Spring

The National Predictive Services in conjunction with the National Interagency Fire Center released on Jan. 1 the National Significant Wildlife Fire Potential Outlook for the period covering February, March and April 2018.

From February through April significant fire potential is expected to increase to above normal across portions of Texas and Oklahoma, where a warmer and drier than average pattern in the southern Plains has produced an expansion and intensification of drought conditions.

Low humidity and gusty wind cold frontal events will continue to produce episodes of elevated to high fire risks across portions of Oklahoma, Texas, and Western Arkansas, where the drought is expected to deepen. Fuel sources will be very receptive and fire risks should trend to above average levels from February onward. Above average grass loadings will magnify risks for large and higher rates of spread fire potential.

Persistent dry conditions and warmer than average temperatures from weakening La Niña weather patterns in the surface waters across the equatorial Pacific Ocean will produce an average potential for wildland fires. High dead fuel loadings left behind by hurricanes Harvey, Irma, and Maria will continue to pose unique fire danger concerns for coastal Texas and will need to be considered, should drier conditions emerge.

February BQA Tip: Don't Let Low BCS Affect Pregnancy Rates

The body condition score (BCS) of a cow prior to or at calving is the major factor affecting pregnancy rates. To optimize pregnancy rates, 2- and 3-year-old females should be in a BCS of 6 or better at calving. Cows 4 years old or older should be in a BCS of 5 or greater. After calving, weight loss should be controlled so that cows don't lose more than 1 body condition score in about a 100-day period. If hay or forage quality is low, appropriate supplementation to achieve or maintain these targets will ensure that low BCS does not reduce pregnancy rates.
