Do you want to strengthen the U.S. cattle industry's ability to respond to a disease outbreak? Are you interested in implementing radio frequency identification (RFID) tags at your operation as a management tool? Do you want to explore marketing your cattle for premiums associated with value-added data? If you market enough cattle to make a truckload and sell cattle to or place with a Traceability Pilot participating feedyard, you could be eligible to take part in a pilot traceability program.

The program is a voluntary, industry-driven solution to cattle disease traceability with an optional value-added component. Your data is confidential and secure and will not be shared without your explicit permission. Disease traceability information will only be shared with a state animal health official when requested for a specific traceback. and carcass data may be available.

Stolen Forklift Recovered Near Pecos

A stolen \$80,000 forklift has been recovered, thanks to an investigation by Deputy Sam Cobos of the Reeves County Sheriff's Office and TSCRA Special Ranger Clay McKinney.

The investigation began on Aug. 2, 2019, after a representative from Komatsu Southwest, a Carlsbad, New Mexico, equipment rental company, contacted the Reeves County Sheriff's Office to report the stolen forklift. The representative told authorities that they discovered the missing Xtreme Telehandler Forklift during a recent inventory. It was last rented to a Pecos area company in June 2017.

The following week, McKinney was contacted and asked to assist in the investigation. He interviewed numerous individuals and quickly developed several leads to the possible location of the stolen equipment. McKinney eventually found the forklift on a ranch approximately 20 miles southeast of Pecos. Deputies from the Reeves County Sheriff's Office were called to the scene and took possession.

Special Ranger McKinney and Deputy Cobos are actively investigating the theft. According to McKinney, they have identified a suspect but are not releasing the name at this time.

The suspect will likely face a third-degree felony theft charge, which comes with a penalty of up to 10 years in prison and \$10,000 in fines if convicted.

Skiatook Man Sentenced in 2018 Cattle Thefts

Michael Joseph Demaro, 44, of Skiatook, was convicted and sentenced in August, on multiple counts of larceny of domestic animals, cattle. The convictions are the result of an investigation by TSCRA Special Ranger Bart Perrier.

According to Perrier, from June 21 to 27, 2018, cattle thefts were reported from three victims near Avant in rural Osage County. After an investigation, some of the stolen animals were located at livestock markets across northeastern Oklahoma and southern Kansas. With the assistance of local law enforcement and special agents with the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Perrier was able to identify additional stolen cattle belonging to the victims.

Demaro, along with an accomplice, Cody Joseph Porter, 32, of Sperry, were identified as suspects in the thefts and charged with three counts of larceny each. Demaro entered a guilty plea Aug. 13 before the Osage County District Court and was sentenced to 20 years in the custody of the Oklahoma Department of Corrections for each charge, to run concurrently. He will serve 10 years in prison and another 10 on probation. Restitution will also be required, but the amount has not yet been determined.

His accomplice, Porter, was sentenced in February.
